Our supporters will remember that one of Limapela's fundamental aims is self-sufficiency, as a community development principle, and so that school running costs can be covered from locally generated profits. Our small plot of potatoes is nearly ready for harvest. With the coming of the wet season, the ground is being cultivated and other crops will be planted very soon. Our long-term plans include bananas and chickens.
